Let's Wonder and Create

Let's wonder about the weather. How many different types of weather can you name? You could make a poster with illustrations and words to show all the different kinds of weather that you can think of. Try to think of 'extreme'

weather as well such as a tornado.  You could also put your favourite kind of weather on it too. If you would like to research weather a bit more (with an adult to keep you safe online) then this is a website for kids about the weather!

Why not make your own 'warm colours' flower art? There are lots of flowers in bloom at the moment so you could choose something from your garden or from a walk you might go on. Some of you might have planted sunflowers to grow in your garden. You could sketch them as they grow, a bit like a diary of what's happening.

Be Active:

Your daily exercise might be Joe Wicks at 9am each day and Go Noodle has dances that are a good fun way of exercising. Have you ever set yourself any sporting challenges? Why not try to have a go this week and see how you do. ***We recommend that you do at least 2 hours of exercise a week.***

Time to Talk:

As a family you could talk about the weather and which kind you like the most or which ones you don't like so much. You can find out if you think the same or differently to each other! Scientists say that the weather is changing and it's because of global warming. Why not research about this with an adult? What can you find out? 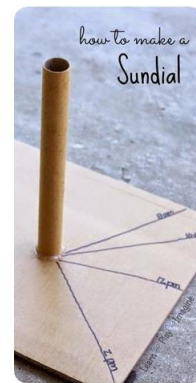
