

Spelling/Spag Summer 1, Week 1 Homophones

Homophones are words that sound the same when you say them but they have different spellings.

Try this... say sea



and then say see.



They sound the same but have different spellings. Why not draw pictures for the other homophone spellings or use the sheet with pictures to help you.

Spelling: their, they're, there, here, hear, see, sea, to, two, too

Spag: To extend my sentences using because and other different conjunctions from the box.

Choose two or three words to learn each day and then practise them in a sentence. Make sure that you use 'because' in your sentence.

You could challenge yourself to try to use pairs of homophones in one sentence. E.g. 'I like to see the beautiful blue sea because it makes me feel happy.'

if, so, and, because, but, when, then, although, as well as.

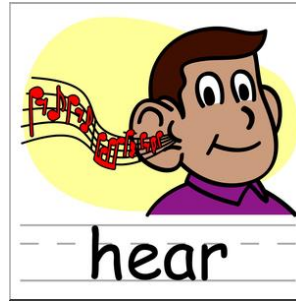

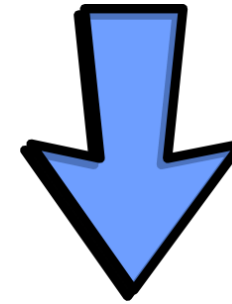

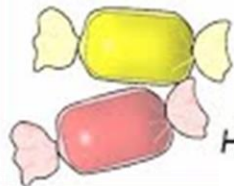
