

Spelling/Spag Summer 1, Week 2 Homophones/Near Homophones

Homophones are words that sound the same when you say them but they have different spellings.

Try this... say bear



and then say bare.



They sound the same but have different spellings. Why not draw pictures for the other homophone spellings or use the sheet with pictures to help you.

Spelling: be, bee, quite, quiet, bare, bear, one, won, son, sun

*Spag: To extend my sentences using because and other different conjunctions from the box **as well as using adjectives to describe nouns.***

Choose two or three words to learn each day and then practise them in a sentence. Make sure that you use 'because' in your sentence.

*You could challenge yourself to try to use pairs of homophones in one sentence. E.g. It was quite quiet in the **big** classroom because everybody was hard at work.*

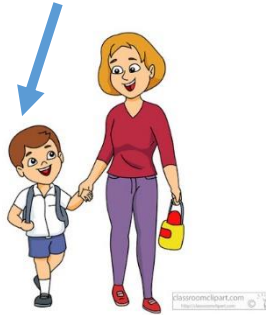
