



Dear Parents/Carers,

On Monday 8th November, we will be completing a Stone Age-themed day. Throughout the last half term, the children have shown a fantastic attitude and interest towards all things to do with the Stone Age. This day aims to consolidate the children's learning through several practical indoor and outdoor activities.

Due to some of these activities taking place outdoors, we would like to advise that on Monday, children come with suitable clothing for outdoors such as waterproof shoes and a coat.

In the morning we will be completing an orienteering challenge where the children will have a map to read with the task of finding objects relating to the Stone Age within the school grounds. This will be followed by a lesson on Stone Age Hunting where children will be throwing foam javelins at cutouts of Stone Age beasts.

The afternoon will consist of creative lessons around the theme of Stone Age settlements and cave paintings. As a class, we will create a small version of a Stone Age shelter by weaving sticks around a frame and smearing clay onto our structure to fill in any gaps. This means there may be a chance that children could get their clothes a bit messy and so they may need to be dressed accordingly.
