In 2020/2021, Holmfirth J I & N School received £17,780.00 for PE and Sport premium funding. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic we carried forward a sum of £4352.90 from the school year 2019/2020. The report below details how our spending links to the intent of Key Performance Indicators, which are a condition of this grant. The implementation is explained fully and the impact we have seen is documented. We have been able to track the impact this spending has had on our pupils by keeping clear records of participation and extra-curricular attendance.

We are happy to report that this funding will continue into the next academic year and our report outlines how we intend to sustain our current spending and our next steps and aims to enable us to continue to improve our PE and Sport provision.

IMPLEMENTATION

To continue to forge sporting links with local schools by being part of a local network of schools, overseen by Pennine Sports Partnership (based at Holmfirth High School). Allowing us to learn from the expertise of specialist teachers. Giving pupils the opportunities to take part in both competitive and non-competitive sport locally. Forging links with pupils from other school. **(KPI 1,2,3,4,5)**

Pennine Sports Partnership - £8740.00

To further develop and “upskill” staff’s ability to teach exciting, differentiated and active lessons with clear progression. Holmfirth Junior Infant and Nursery school are continuing to bring in PE specialist teachers and coaches one day per week (every Friday) to work alongside class teachers in lessons and share expertise. It continues to be our aim that our children will gain new skills and experiences and teachers and coaches one day per week (every Friday) to work alongside class teachers in lessons and share expertise and teachers will learn new techniques and knowledge to aid them in the teaching of Sport and PE both this year and in the future.

The long-term aim is higher quality lessons and improved learning for all children. Increased confidence for teachers in the delivery of:

All children from each class experienced a broader range of sport and activities. Children took part in a range of outdoor activities such as; bushcraft, mini orienteering and campfire building. Children loved competing against each other and were so excited to participate in activities they would not normally do in school. These outdoor sessions have significantly helped pupils with their overall fitness levels, mental wellbeing, enjoyment of school and outdoor pursuits. **(KPI 1,2,3,4,5)**

SUSTAINABILITY & NEXT STEPS

Pennine Sports Partnership – the quality of expertise training pupils and staff receive make this Partnership so successful. We have continued our Partnership in 2021/2022 and will use our Sports Premium funding to pay for this.

TaylorMade Outdoor Learning – all children have thoroughly enjoyed these sessions. The carried forward balance of £4284.20 has already been committed to future outdoor sessions in the Autumn term 2021, along with the remainder of our funding for 2021/2022.
